



AFRICA/LIBYA - "The Catholic community has resumed its activities," says the Apostolic Vicar of Benghazi

Benghazi(Agenzia Fides) - "We have resumed the normal pace of our activities" says to Fides His Exc. Mgr. Sylvester Carmel Magro, Apostolic Vicar of Benghazi, in Libya. "Today, for example, we celebrate the Novena of Our Lady of Salvation, to whom the Filipinos are very devout. On the occasion of the main Mass of the week, which is celebrated on Friday morning, the church is always crowded with worshipers. It is the sign - continues Mgr. Magro - we have resumed the pace as it was before the war of 2011. The faithful are all foreigners: Filipinos and a large number of Africans, many of whom are in search of work and in need of material assistance. " According to media reports, in Benghazi, on the evening of June 4, there were clashes in the district of Abouhdima, between the military police and members of a local militia, which resulted in one victim and several wounded. Mgr. Magro does not have the impression that the situation is out of control. "In Benghazi - says the Apostolic Vicar – life is almost normal. Every now and then explosions in the distance can be heard, but otherwise people lead their lives as always. People go to work and shops are open.
